19th Annual National Association for Chicano Studies Conference April 24-27, Holiday Inn Hermosillo, Sonora, México

The Nineteenth Annual NACS Conference is being held in Mexico for the first time. The Conference is being sponsored by the Mexican American Studies and Research Center at the University of Arizona. Conference Coordinator is Dr. Macario Saldate IV, (602) 621-7551, Fax: (602) 621-7966.

The conference theme is "Los Dos Méxicos" and the Site Committee is working hard to coordinate panels and sessions that will integrate Chicano and Mexicano scholars. Various speakers will address issues of concern: Dr. Antonio Estrada, University of Arizona, will speak about Chicano/Mexicano health issues; Dr. Jorge Bustamante, Director of the Colegio de la Frontera Norte, will speak on immigration issues as will Dr. Susan Gonzales Baker, University of Arizona. The Conference promises to be an interesting and stimulating one. We hope to see you there.

Although the Holiday Inn is the main conference site, the University of Arizona has done an excellent job of finding alternative hotels. Please call them for more information. You must present proof of American citizenship, or other citizenship, to travel into Mexico and back. You will need a birth certificate, notarized voter registration form, or a valid passport. If you are driving your own vehicle you will need the following: auto registration form, Mexican auto insurance (check with your own carrier). If your insurance company does not handle Mexican auto insurance, it is available at the RAMA Mexican Auto Insurance Agency in Tucson (602)325-5542. If you drive someone else's vehicle, you will need a notarized letter of permission to take said vehicle across the border. This letter must include the Vehicle I.D. #, the driver's name, dates of permission and destination as well as the name and signature of the person granting permission. You will also need the auto registration form, proof of Mexican auto insurance, and your proof of citizenship for crossing the border.
