

sjDANCEco, San José's professional contemporary dance company and resident dance company in the School of Music and Dance, recently completed a successful 12th Season at the historic California Theatre in downtown San José. The program featured José Limón's exquisite masterwork *Mazurkas* to the music of Frederic Chopin, a revival of Artistic Director and Dance Professor **Gary Masters**' 1980 *Broken Memory* to the music of Serge Rachmaninov, and three premieres by faculty members **Heather Cooper**, **Maria Basile**, and Alumna **Hsiang Hsiu Lin**.

Dancing the Charleston in Russia

Vintage dance historian **Joan Walton** traveled to Moscow, Russia to teach at the Moscow International Festival of Historical Dance in August. This annual festival is attended by enthusiastic dancers who love the concept of time travel: wearing the costumes, learning the dances, and listening to the music of earlier times. This year, Professor Walton taught social dances and graces, beginning with an 1899 quadrille and ending with the 1930s Foxtrot. She returns next year to teach 19th-century dances in addition to other 20th-century styles.
