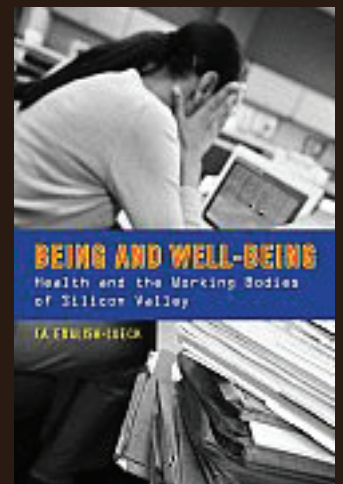
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Come hear Jan English-Lueck talk about the unique and medically diverse health culture that has emerged in the Silicon Valley.

Dr. Jan English-Lueck is an anthropologist, associate dean of the College of Social Sciences at San José State University, and a distinguished fellow at the Institute for the Future. She has written ethnographies detailing the lives of California's alternative healers and China's scientists. She is also the author of several books on Silicon Valley that explore how working in Silicon Valley shapes our communities, families and bodies. These works include *Cultures@Silicon Valley*, winner of the American Anthropological Association's 2006 Diana Forsythe Prize for the anthropology of science and technology, and *Busier than Ever! Why American Families Can't Slow Down* (with Charles Darrah and James Freeman), and *Being and Well-being: Health and the Working Bodies of Silicon Valley*.



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
