Award winning Indonesian authors and translators will present their work and discuss global interest topics such as human rights, global religious tolerance, environmental concerns and women's equalization.

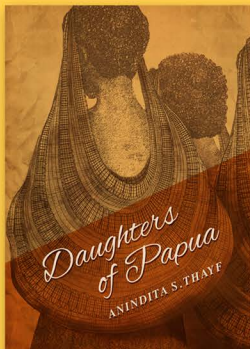


Kei
