From the Director's Pen:

Alan Ayckbourn has been called Britain's Neil Simon, but he is, like the title of one of his comedies, an 'Absurd Person Singular', and uniquely the director of his own theatre at Scarborough where all of his plays were first staged. Some seventeen have then achieved success in London's West End, five at The National Theatre, where Ayckbourn is currently a director/playwright in residence. He gave the following answers to an interviewer there:

Interviewer: Why do you write?

Ayckbourn: My more successful plays I write for money. The less successful . . . due to a deep subconscious urge to change the world for the better.

Interviewer: How long did it take you write *Bedroom Farce*?

Ayckbourn: Three or four sleepless nights . . . For 360 days (a year) I think about writing, consider, contemplate and successfully avoid writing . . . (but) eventually I have to for my other self-Director of Productions.

Interviewer: Why do you describe *Bedroom Farce* as a comedy as well as a farce?

Ayckbourn: Comedy, I read somewhere, consists of larger-than-life characters in real situations. Farce, on the other hand, portrays real characters projected into incredible situations. *Bedroom Farce* is a comedy about real characters who, projected into incredible situations, start behaving in a larger-than-life manner as the situations appear to them too horribly real. I'm with Chekhov (who) called his plays comedies or farces whenever he felt like it.

Interviewer: Why are there three beds in *Bedroom Farce*?

Ayckbourn: I like threes. It's a comic number . . . a symmetrical number. Yet it's unbalanced. Most of my plays are about people caught off balance. Besides, I couldn't get any more beds on stage at Scarborough.

Hal J. Todd, Director

has acted and directed for regional professional theatres such as the Pittsburgh Playhouse, the Seattle Repertory, the San Francisco Actor's Workshop and the American Conservatory Theatre; for Shakespeare festivals at San Diego, Ashland, Oregon, and Boulder, Colorado; at Universal and M.G.M. Studios; and at Carnegie Tech and Northwestern Universities. He is a member of the Screen Actors Guild, the Director's Guild, and the Screenwriters



Guild. He has been a SJSU faculty member since 1964 and was Department Chair between 1964 and 1982. His first SJSU production was *Lysistrata*, his most recent, *The Night of The Iguana*, with Shakespeare and Mollere, Chekhov and O'Casey some of his favorites along the way. Dr. Todd and his history professor wife, Joan, visit London frequently to see theatre. He found the comedy *Tishoo* there, and directed it last season at The Saratoga Chamber Theatre. He also became a fan of Alan Ayckbourn when he saw *The Norman Conquests*. Since that takes three nights, our play tonight is *Bedroom Farce*.

Bridget Kowalczyk MFA Candidate

was born and raised in Detroit, Michigan. She received her BFA in Acting from Wayne State University where her favorite roles played were Lady Capulet, Mary Mae Gregor in *The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie*, and Helen Jones in *Machinal*. In 1986 Bridget won the SJSU Dorothy Kaucher Contest for Excellence in Oral Interpretation for a presentation from *The Belle of Amherst*. She was also seen as Hannah in *Night of the Iguana*. This summer, she played Grandma in *The Sandbox* under the direction of Edward Albee at Cal Poly as part of the C.S.U. Summer Arts Program. Bridget plans to continue teaching and acting in the Bay Area upon completion of her Master's degree in May 1988.
