Use "Scan" app

You find the article (above) by searching google but the full-text is not available freely online. You know the library has this journal in print and so you head over to the periodicals section. You find the publication by title (Psychology Today), by month and year (Mar/Apr2001, Vol. 34 Issue 2), and then by the pages the article is on (41).

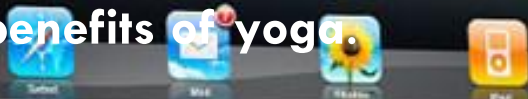
Oops, looks like the first article is not what your professor is asking you to find because it is not a peer-reviewed article.
